Education for your child

Children 5 years old or older as of September 1st are eligible to be enrolled into the public school system.

Laws

- Car Seat Law: Infants must ride in a rear-facing seat until they are both 1 year old **and** 20 pounds. After that they must ride in a forward-facing car seat until they reach 40 pounds or reach the maximum weight limit for that car seat. Once they outgrow their forward-facing car seat they must ride in a booster seat until they are 4'9" tall or 8 years old.
- Home Alone Law: You cannot leave your child alone until they reach 10 years of age.
- Babysitting: It is highly recommended that your child be 12 years old or older before they are allowed to care for other children.
- Bike Helmet Law: Children under the age of 16 must wear a helmet while riding a bike.
